

Level 2 Progression Performing and Production Arts

Whether you aim to be an actor, dancer, director or stage manager or you are just genuinely interested in the Performing Arts, this course prepares you for the next step towards your chosen career. We will support you to develop the creative, technical and organisational skills required to progress onto Level 3.

Why choose this course?

This course will provide students with an introduction to performance, production and design for the performing arts, enabling them to both acquire the requisite skills, knowledge and understanding to progress to further education and employment within the performing arts industry.

What will I learn?

The course is structured around 8 hours of Performing and Production Arts and a further 8 hours of work towards English and Mathematics qualifications, plus a one-hour tutorial slot.

This course has been designed to incorporate a strong element of collaborative and vocational learning to provide students with the understanding, knowledge and skills identified as necessary for future progression and employment, underpinned by the broad transferrable skills that will enable students to demonstrate qualities of adaptability, self-reliance, collaboration, dependability, imagination, and creativity.

You will learn about the range of activities essential to the development and delivery of a performance such as: drama, dance, the process of rehearsal and production and delivery of a performance. You will get the opportunity to demonstrate your understanding through the production of a staged piece of work.

Assessment Arrangements

This course will be delivered via nine units over a one-year period. These units will be assessed through a combination of portfolios of evidence, assignments, and a final project.

Information & Support

Learners are encouraged to extend their musical listening and have access to a range of digital resources. We also encourage learners to attend performances and screenings at the college as part of our department calendar of events throughout the year (many of which are free).

All Progression 2 pathways will include English and Maths up to Level 2. You will study either GCSE or Functional Skills to ensure that you achieve Level 2 before progressing onto Level 3 courses.

Your personal tutor will work with you to support you manage your workload and to plan your progression. Study Centre sessions are also available to help with coursework and study skills.

Where will it take me?

Completion of this course along with either a GCSE Grade 4 or above in Maths or English will provide you with the entry requirements for Level 3 study. Many students go on to complete Level 3 Extended Diplomas in Performing and Production Arts.

What will I need?

Three GCSEs at Grade 3 including English Language (or Literature) and/or Mathematics.
